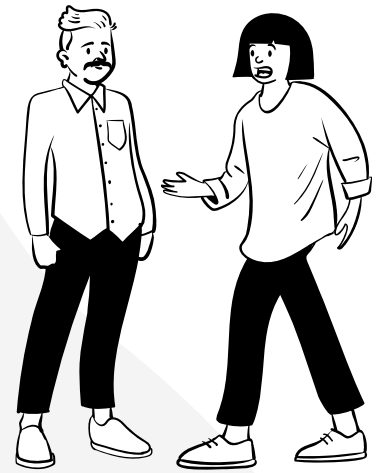


# COVID-19 CODE OF CONDUCT

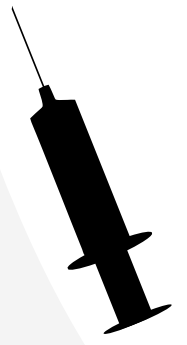

## TAKE CARE OF YOUR COMMUNITY

We want everyone to be and feel safe. As a member of the PPLE community, we ask you to take care of one another by following our Code of Conduct guidelines. These rules help to limit the spread of Covid-19 and make the university a safe place for all.



- Perform a self-test twice a week;
- Whenever possible, keep 1,5 metres social distancing;
- If you have any mild symptoms, stay at home and take a free coronavirus test at the GGD. Note: a self-test is insufficient when you have (mild) symptoms, please go to the GGD;
- If you have been in contact with a person who tested positive for coronavirus, read here what you have to do;
- Follow the signs and guidance in the building and on the campus;
- Wear a face mask in the UvA campus buildings (from/to lecture halls/offices, in corridors, stairwells, lifts, toilets, etc.). The face mask can be taken off during class when everyone has taken their seat, but feel free to keep your face mask on if this makes you feel safer.
- Regularly wash your hands and use hand sanitizer;
- Please be aware that teaching staff has the prerogative to set additional norms in their classes.

## UTILIZE SELF-TESTING AND VACCINATIONS

Self-testing and vaccinations allow us all to contribute to a safe campus and to the further easing of measures in the education system. Therefore, every student is asked to perform a self-test at least twice a week, also when you are fully vaccinated. We urge and hope that all will participate. And – of course – you should stay at home if you, unfortunately, tested positive. If so, please follow up with a [coronavirus test at the GGD](#). For more info, check out this government site. Self-tests can be ordered free of charge at [zelftestonderwijs.nl](http://zelftestonderwijs.nl).

We urge everyone to get vaccinated (unless you are unable to do so for medical reasons). Dutch students can make an [appointment with the GGD](#). International students can visit a vaccination unit on the Roeterseiland campus from 6 to 10 September. You will not be required to prove that you have been staying in the Netherlands or to have a BSN number.

The GGD has set up a special appointment hotline for international students: (+31) 020 5555 202. Dutch students can also choose to get vaccinated at the on-campus GGD vaccination unit from 6 to 10 September, but only if there is additional capacity. This will not require any advance appointment.

## ENSURE SAFE STUDY SPACES

To ensure safe study spaces, all members of our community must stay home and have themselves tested at the GGD when experiencing (mild) corona-related symptoms. You will also have to stay at home while you are waiting for your test results. This means you cannot physically go to campus when you have corona-related complaints until you have been tested negative by the GGD or after the required isolation period.
